This is to certify that the following article appeared on the warrant for the Special Town Meeting, September 25, 2006 in Chilmark, together with the action taken thereon.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the town will vote to amend Article 1 of the June 18, 2001 Special Town Meeting that established the Community Preservation Committee by striking the reference to the Chilmark member of the Dukes County Regional Housing Authority and inserting the Chilmark Housing Committee into the third sentence and so that it reads (new wording is in **BOLD TYPE**)

The committee shall consist of nine (9) members and shall include one member of each of the following organizations: Conservation Commission, Planning Board, Park and Recreation Committee, Historical Commission, Board of Selectmen, **Housing Committee**, and three (3) At-Large members of the public, named and appointed by the Board of Selectmen.

Action on ARTICLE 23. Read by moderator. Moved and seconded. Passed unanimously.

SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

June 18, 2001

TELLER: No tellers were appointed because of the small number attending.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. Constable Daniel Bryant, read the return of the warrant attesting to the posting. Of the 771 persons qualified to vote in the Town of Chilmark, 76 were present.

Moderator Everett Poole asked if there was anyone on the meeting floor who was not a registered voter. Mr. Poole asked for a moment of silence in memory of Herbert H. Hancock. He then spoke on a lighter note of the Town Quilt that was being exhibited at this evenings meeting, asking that the people responsible for the handiwork come up to be photographed with the quilt.


Article 1. Read by moderator, moved and second. Selectman Warren Doty spoke about the fact that the Commonwealth of Massachusetts set guide lines for the formation of this committee. Mr. Doty said that there was a choice of (5) five minimum or a maximum of (9) nine members. He said that the Selectman choose nine because it would afford the most input from as many townspeople as possible. Article 1 came to a vote and carried.

Article 2. Read by moderator, moved and seconded. Steven Flanders asked why these funds could not be paid by the 3% surcharge on the property taxes. Timothy Carroll stated that he had looked into being reimbursed for start-up costs and that there was no way to get funding from monies that had not yet been collected. He also said the percentage of monies collected that were to be set aside for administration of the C.P.A. would not be enough to cover these costs. Mr. Carroll said that he would continue to pursue the possibilities. Article 2 came to a vote and Mr. Poole stated it appeared to be carried, with nothing more said, it was carried.

Article 3. Read by moderator, moved and seconded. There was no discussion. Article 3 came to a vote and passed unanimously.


With no further business to come before this Special Town Meeting, Mr. Poole declared the meeting dissolved at 7:40 p.m.

WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING

June 18th, 2001

COUNTY OF DUKES COUNTY, SS.

To the Constables of the Town of Chilmark,

GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby directed to warn and notify the inhabitants of the Town of Chilmark, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to assemble at the Chilmark Community Center in said Town of Chilmark on Monday, the eighteenth day of June in the year Two thousand and one AD at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, there and then to act on the Articles in this Warrant.


ARTICLE 1. To see if the town will vote to establish a Community Preservation Committee to implement the Community Preservation Act, approved by the Town at the March 21st 2001 Special Town Meeting. The committee shall study the needs of the Town regarding community preservation (Open Space, Affordable Housing & Historical Preservation), consult with local boards, hold public informational hearings and make recommendations to the Town Meeting for authorized spending under the Act. The committee shall consist of nine (9) members and shall include one member of each of the following organizations: Conservation Commission, Planning Board, Park and Recreation Committee, Historical Commission, Board of Selectmen, the Chilmark member of the Dukes County Regional Housing Authority, and three (3) At-Large members of the public, named and appointed by the Board of Selectmen. The board, committee or commission members shall be designated by their respective board, committee, or commission, and appointed by the Selectmen. They shall serve for a term of one (1) year.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the town will vote to appropriate from available funds in the treasury the sum of \$17,500.00 to fund implementation costs associated with the Community Preservation Act.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the town will vote to appropriate from available funds in the treasury the sum of \$10,000.00 to fund digitizing of the town tax maps for use in a Geographical Information System (GIS) by town departments and committees; including the payment of costs incidental and related thereto.

You are hereby directed to serve this warrant by posting attested copies in three public places in said Town of Chilmark at least fourteen days before the time of said meeting, and to publish said warrant in one newspaper having general circulation in the Town of Chilmark during the two weeks before said meeting.


