

Community Preservation Survey FY 2021-22

We Need Your Input

The Community Preservation Act (CPA) is a state law which allows communities to raise funds dedicated to community preservation projects in three categories: open space/recreation, historic preservation, and community housing. By law, a minimum of 10% of the annual revenue must be allocated to each area. In November 2016, Watertown residents voted to adopt a 2% property tax surcharge which also qualifies the community for annual state matching funds. **There is over \$12.8 million of CPA funding available.**

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) is charged with vetting project proposals through an application process with final project recommendations sent to the City Council for review and allocation of funding. Each year, the CPC must review the community's needs and priorities for potential CPA project funding. FY 2021-22 Project Recommendations:

Historic Preservation: City Hall Geographical Paintings

The CPC is recommending a grant of \$33,000 to the Watertown Historical Society to restore and conserve two paintings that flank the lobby of City Hall. Each will be protected by a barrier constructed of wooden and metal rails.

Open Space/ Outdoor Recreation: Irving Park

The CPC is recommending a grant of \$294,195 to the Department of Public Works to rehabilitate Irving Park with new plantings, seating, bollard lighting, a granite border, safety fencing, and accessible walkways.

á (Community Housing: CPA funds may be used to acquire, create, preserve, or support community housing for low- and moderate-income individuals, families, and seniors whose income is less than 100% of areawide median income AMI) to ensure that Watertown continues to be a diverse community. The 2021 moderate-income limit (<100% AMI) or a household of 1 is \$84,560 and the low-income limit (<80% AMI) is \$67,648. For a household of 4, the moderate- income limit is \$120,800 and the low-income limit is \$96,640.
